

Let's Talk about this Artwork!

- What do you see?
- Where can we find flowers?
- What colors make up these flowers?
- Describe the shapes we're seeing.
- How might these flowers be moving?
 Is the movement slow or quick?
- If you could put this vase in your home, where would you put it?
 - What would you use it for?
- Do you have useful objects in your house that you find beautiful? What are they?

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Supplies

- 1. Tempera or Acrylic Paint*
- 2. Paintbrushes
- 3. Water and cup for water
- 2 pieces of white multimedia or watercolor paper (any heavyweight paper will work!)
- 5. 9x11 construction paper in various colors
- 6. Construction paper scraps
- 7. Scissors
- 8. Glue sticks

*if you don't have paint, use crayons!



Project Skills

- 1. Painting
- 2. Cutting
- 3. Tearing
- 4. Gluing
- 5. Collaging

Project Instructions



- 1. Fold your (watercolor or other heavyweight) white paper in half.
- 2. Paint one half or paint each half different colors. (2-5 mins.)







3. Fold your paper closed again to mix the colors. Rub the paper so your paint blends. Unfold to dry. (2-5 mins.)

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4. Apply green paint your second piece of heavyweight white paper to make the stems and leaves. (2-5 mins.)



- 5. Watch "The Tiny Seed" by Eric Carle <u>virtual read aloud here</u> while your paint dries.
- 6. Cut or tear flower petals from your unfolded, first painted paper. (2-5 mins.)
- 7. Cut or tear stems and leaves from your green-painted paper. (2-5 mins.)
- 8. Cut or tear the centers of your flowers from construction paper scraps. (2-5 mins.)



9. Assemble your artwork by gluing into place the stem, leaves, petals, and flowers' centers onto a piece of construction paper. (2-5 mins.) *Optional: Embellish center of flower with crayons!*
