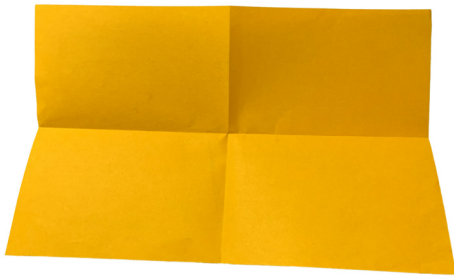


# RALSTON CRAWFORD: AIR + SPACE + WAR

## Design an at-home Paper Airplane!

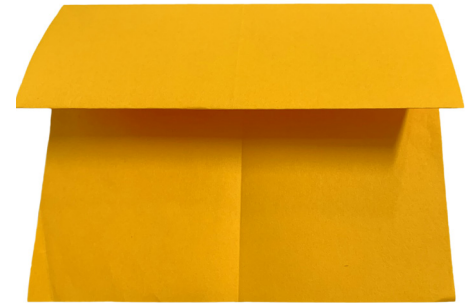
Follow these directions to create your own Crawford-inspired paper airplane. Use a bright 8.5x11" sheet of paper or use plain and add your own from the color swatches on the reverse.



Cut off a 1.5" strip from the long side. Then, fold the paper in half vertically as well as horizontally to create creases.



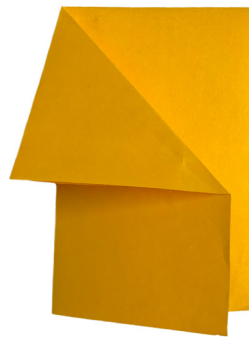
Fold just the top part halfway down to meet the center crease.



Fold the entire sheet in half, folding along the center crease.



Fold sheet again vertically. Edges should be on the outside.



Turn so the folded edge is on your left. Fold right top corner down diagonally so it lines up with the left edge.



Flip and fold remaining top corner in the same way.

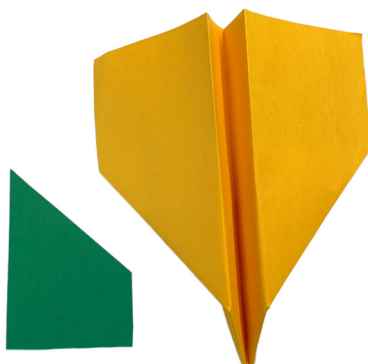

Now fold the wings down one at a time. Make your folds about 1" above and parallel to the bottom of the plane.



Make a tail wing from the strip you first cut off. If you want a wider tail, use a separate piece of paper. Now is also a great time to add color!



Staple the bottom of the paper airplane to hold it together. Place one staple near the nose and one near the rear of the plane.



**Your paper airplane is complete – time to test it out!**
